Reading this text in Lent and at the start of autumn sounded as if God was encouraging or even persuading Abram to step into the autumn season in God's plan of making a great and new nation for himself. There is something in the text that suggests a sense of reluctance on the part of Abram and if you have ever given up something that is meaningful to you, I am sure that you could relate to this sense of reluctance.

However if you have never left your country, your family and your father's house, this God's call to Abram would have a different meaning for you. And so, as we journey through this Lent, I would like to invite you to listen to what God is saying to you in your unique circumstances, not so much to God's call to Abram, Moses, Peter, James and John; but to you.

Next weekend is our Parish Ministry Sunday weekend. The mission and ministries of the church is for everyone both in terms of giving and in terms of receiving. As your parish priest, I have received more from you than I can ever give back to you and the church. It is with this feeling of gratitude that I invite you to consider how you might be able to continue or begin to assist in our Parish ministries. Take time to pray and please listen to what the spirit is saying to you. The 2023 Ministry Forms will be available for you to pick up or you can scan our Ministry QR code to register your interest. You can commit your energy, skills and time ranging from 30 minutes up to but not more than 12 hours/week. We have a real need for new volunteers to join us to make the work easier for everyone.

Next Sunday: Third Sunday of Lent Exodus 17:3-7 Romans 5:1-2, 5-8 John 4:5-42

Second Sunday of Lent (Year A)

First Reading: Genesis 12:1–4 Every year, on the Second Sunday of Lent, we turn to Abraham, our father in faith, to learn something more of what it means to follow the Lord's call. In this reading, Abram leaves his home, trusting in God's promise.

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:8–10 In this Sunday's Second Reading, Paul urges the young bishop Timothy to model his life and ministry on what he has learnt from Paul himself: bearing hardships for the sake of the Gospel, relying always on God's grace. This is good advice for us, too, as we continue our Lenten journey.

Gospel: Matthew 17:1–9 The Transfiguration of Jesus is concerned with his identity. Having just made the second prediction of the Passion, Matthew is keen to reassure us that for Jesus, death does not mean dishonour: the one who is to be crucified is the one who is gloriously transfigured, the one to whom we must listen.

CHAPTER FOUR: INTEGRAL ECOLOGY

III. ECOLOGY IN DAILY LIFE

152. Lack of housing is a grave problem in many parts of the world, both in rural areas and in large cities, since state budgets usually cover only a small portion of the demand. Not only the poor, but many other members of society as well, find it difficult to own a home. Having a home has much to do with a sense of personal dignity and the growth of families. This is a major issue for human ecology. In some places, where makeshift shanty towns have sprung up, this will mean developing those neighbourhoods rather than razing or displacing them. When the poor live in unsanitary slums or in dangerous tenements, "in cases where it is necessary to relocate them, in order not to heap suffering upon suffering, adequate information needs to be given beforehand, with choices of decent housing offered, and the people directly involved must be part of the process". At the same time, creativity should be shown in integrating rundown neighbourhoods into a welcoming city: "How beautiful those cities which overcome paralyzing mistrust, integrate those who are different and make this very integration a new factor of development! How attractive are those cities which, even in their architectural design, are full of spaces which connect, relate and favour the recognition of others!


