Fourth Sunday of Easter - 30th April 2023

Dear Parishioners.

On this World Day of Prayer for Vocations, I would like to thank and congratulate you for sharing and spreading our one common and universal Vocation: The Call to be Christians. This call was made to "The whole house of Israel" and "the promise made for... children, and for all those who are far away" has continued to be relevant, thanks to you.



You have followed the good shepherd and the author of our vocation to wherever he leads you. Even though like sheep we sometimes go astray, by grace we always come back to the shepherd and guardian of our souls.

Here in Australia and keeping to our National Anthem, for those who have come across the seas, we not only have boundless plains to share but have faith to profess. The diversity of opinions, worldviews and cultures, which is sometimes seen as obstacle to the thriving of our faith has become in our days an opportunity for the witnessing of the power of the Holy Spirit. In the words of Archbishop Mark Coleridge, "The face of the Church around the world is changing as the centre of gravity shifts from places like Europe and North America (and Australia) to Africa, Asia and Latin America... Certainly in the Archdiocese of Brisbane the presence of people who have come from overseas is growing stronger... These large and growing communities have gifts for the whole Church, and increasingly the centre of gravity in the Church here is moving in their direction. Therefore, they have to be brought more to the centre-stage in the life and mission of the Archdiocese, since much of the real spiritual energy in the Church here is found among them." What do we make of this strong statement and how do we engage in this type of conversation? I would suggest we pray to the Holy Spirit who unites all tongues and leads us to the complete truth of our faith.

As the Parish Priest of one of the multicultural parishes in the world and without fear of contradiction, the most multicultural parish in the Archdiocese of Brisbane, I feel that the above statement from Archbishop Mark cut to the heart and invites us to dialogue with Archbishop Mark on how to sustain 'this real spiritual energy in the church as well as use this energy to bring full life in the world'. You may have to consider coming to the Archdiocesan Summit on Thursday 18th to Saturday 20th May 2023.

This year, the Northern Territory and Queensland's Labour Day coincides with the International Labour Day. Let us celebrate and commemorate the achievements of organised labour as we continue to advocate for the dignity of labour. As many struggle through the high cost of living, inflation and economic crunch more than usual, let us learn to work to live and respect those who work for us. Our Parish Mass on Monday 1st May will be at 9am and offered for the intention of exploited workers around the world. May God bless the work of our hands and may we find fulfilment in work we do.

The month of May is popular in the Catholic Church for May Devotion prayers in groups and private. As the Parish of Our Lady of Lourdes, we will be true to our name if we can increase our devotional prayers through this month especially praying the Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary. If you can, please include me, our parish Youth, Alpha Program, Sacramental Program, Parish Pastoral Council, Parish Finance Council, our Parish Ministries, our schools, our State and Federal Governments, the poor, homeless, jobless, your colleague and your neighbour in your May Devotion prayer intentions.

CHAPTER FOUR: INTEGRAL ECOLOGY

IIV. JUSTICE BETWEEN THE GENERATIONS

160. What kind of world do we want to leave to those who come after us, to children who are now growing up? This question not only concerns the environment in isolation; the issue cannot be approached piecemeal. When we ask ourselves what kind of world we want to leave behind, we think in the first place of its general direction, its meaning and its values. Unless we struggle with these deeper issues, I do not believe that our concern for ecology will produce significant results. But if these issues are courageously faced, we are led inexorably to ask other pointed questions: What is the purpose of our life in this world? Why are we here? What is the goal of our work and all our efforts? What need does the earth have of us? It is no longer enough, then, simply to state that we should be concerned for future generations. We need to see that what is at stake is our own dignity. Leaving an inhabitable planet to future generations is, first and foremost, up to us. The issue is one which dramatically affects us, for it has to do with the ultimate meaning of our earthly sojourn.
