Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time - 24th September 2023

Dear Parishioners.

This Sunday, Jesus tells his disciples the parable of a vineyard owner who went out to hire workers at various times of the day for fair pay. Jesus shows how God acts: he offers everyone a space in his Kingdom of salvation. This Kingdom is a gift offered by God to everyone, without any exception.



The owner of a vineyard left home at different times of the day to call workers for his vineyard. He didn't just come out once. He went out at least five times. There was such a need for workers in his vineyard that he spent almost all his time looking for workers. We can say that this boss represents God and it is He who also comes to meet us and invites us to work in his vineyard, the Church. But this must also be our mission, tirelessly reaching out to those who do not yet know the Lord's vineyard. It is also up to us to invite more people to be part of this vineyard.

Jesus shows the gratuitousness and universality of salvation because God is good and generous. In the parable, the payment offered by the boss to his workers represents eternal life, a gift that God reserves for everyone.

Christians of the first or last hour are beloved children of the same Father. God's gift is intended for everyone, equally. Jesus invites us to realize that God freely offers salvation to everyone, the first and the last. The last are the sinners that Jesus came to seek and who, invited by Him, enter the mystery of God's mercy.

Let us ask for the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, so that we know how to respond with dignity and joy to the invitation of the Lord who at all times calls us to follow; and may we be among the good and faithful workers of God's vineyard.

CHAPTER FIVE: LINES OF APPROACH AND ACTION

II. DIALOGUE FOR NEW NATIONAL AND LOCAL POLICIES

181. Here, continuity is essential, because policies related to climate change and environmental protection cannot be altered with every change of government. Results take time and demand immediate outlays which may not produce tangible effects within any one government's term. That is why, in the absence of pressure from the public and from civic institutions, political authorities will always be reluctant to intervene, all the more when urgent needs must be met. To take up these responsibilities and the costs they entail, politicians will inevitably clash with the mindset of short-term gain and results which dominates present-day economics and politics. But if they are courageous, they will attest to their God given dignity and leave behind a testimony of selfless responsibility. A healthy politics is sorely needed, capable of reforming and coordinating institutions, promoting best practices and overcoming undue pressure and bureaucratic inertia. It should be added, though, that even the best mechanisms can break down when there are no worthy goals and values, or a genuine and profound humanism to serve as the basis of a noble and generous society.



In this Season of Creation, we are being called to recognize the global climate emergency in which we are living. The planet is warming dangerously because of our use of fossil fuels and our systems of production and consumption. The ways our economies function and the values they serve are violently depleting and wasting Earth's resources, creating great inequalities, suffering and injustice, feeding brutal conflicts, and exceeding Earth's regenerative capacity.

Earth is crying out, the poor are crying out. The existence and wellbeing of future generations is threatened. Climate experts continue to warn of devastating, severe and destructive changes to all dimensions of life becoming unpreventable within less than a decade unless the global community makes dramatic changes urgently.

In this Season of Creation, we are being called to take up our prophetic responsibility in love to spread the word and to transform the ways we are living upon Earth. We must acknowledge our failures to care for creation and embrace God's ways.

When you come to Mass each weekend take a ribbon from the basket at the foot of the tree and tie it on the tree remembering an act of kindness and appreciation you did this week for the earth and its waterways. Hopefully by the end of the Season of Creation we will see the many actions we have taken for the earth and its rivers.


MISSIONARIES OF THE POOR (MOP)

The next breakfast will be held on **Saturday 7 October from 7am**, in the Avocado Room of the Paloma Centre. A full BBQ breakfast plus


tea, coffee and juices will be available for the usual \$10 per person.


RCIA: A Journey Into Faith For Adults

It is run in small groups to suit the particular needs of the participants and explores topics such as; The Life of Faith, the Sacraments and Ministry & Mission.


The program will commence on **Sunday 8 October at 10:30am** in the Parish Media Room.
