Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time - 15th October 2023


Dear Parishioners,

Let us talk about our financial commitment, responsibility, accountability and the use of money in the service of our Parish ministry and evangelisation. In my first year as a priest, I used to avoid raising the issue of money in pastoral discussions. My pastor then told me "Enoch you cannot do much without money. Your bread and wine, your liturgical books and the pews in the church are provided with the money you avoid talking about." After twelve years, my experience has proved that the administration of church's temporal goods is an important part of my ministry and money is very much involved here. However, I am grateful to those parishioners who volunteer as Parish Financial Council members. Our Parish Financial Council provide great support in oversight of parish operations, parish/school commitment, budgeting, financial management and annual financial reporting.

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)

First Reading: Isaiah 25:6-10 Eating sparingly with little variation in diet was the rule for most peoples of the ancient world. No wonder that a banquet of rich food becomes as symbol of the reign of God on earth. To the Lord's banquet, all nations are invited.

Second Reading: Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20 In this section of the Letter to the Philippians, Paul gives thanks for their hospitality and for sharing with him in his labours and hardships. This reading is again redolent with images of abundance and generosity.

Gospel: Matthew 22:1-14 The image of the wedding banquet is often used in the pages of scripture to point to God's abundant care, both now and in the reign of God to come. Here the abundance of the invitation is such that the king's soldiers are sent to the highways and byways to invite people to share in the king's generosity.

III. DIALOGUE AND TRANSPARENCY IN DECISION-MAKING

183. Environmental impact assessment should not come after the drawing up of a business proposition or the proposal of a particular policy, plan or programme. It should be part of the process from the beginning, and be carried out in a way which is interdisciplinary, transparent and free of all economic or political pressure. It should be linked to a study of working conditions and possible effects on people's physical and mental health, on the local economy and on public safety. Economic returns can thus be forecast more realistically, taking into account potential scenarios and the eventual need for further investment to correct possible undesired effects. A consensus should always be reached between the different stakeholders, who can offer a variety of approaches, solutions and alternatives. The local population should have a special place at the table; they are concerned about their own future and that of their children, and can consider goals transcending immediate economic interest. We need to stop thinking in terms of "interventions" to save the environment in favour of policies developed and debated by all interested parties. The participation of the latter also entails being fully informed about such projects and their different risks and possibilities; this includes not just preliminary decisions but also various follow-up activities and continued monitoring. Honesty and truth are needed in scientific and political discussions; these should not be limited to the issue of whether or not a particular project is permitted by law.

For those with family who have passed away in the last 12 months, a rose will be provided. A family member will have the opportunity to present the rose in front of the altar at Mass in memory of your loved one.






