33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)

First Reading: Proverbs 31:10-13, 19-20, 30-31 The full text of this reading (Wisdom 31:10-31) forms an acrostic poem, so beloved of Hebrew authors. While it depicts a woman of that time going about her daily tasks, she is worthy of praise because what she does, she does well.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:1-6 At the time Paul wrote, the belief was that the Lord's coming was imminent. Paul's advice is to be ready, because the Lord's comes unexpectedly; but also, to have no fear because we are children of light.

Gospel: Matthew 25:14-30 This parable is not about using our God-given gifts to their full extent. In Greek a talent was unit of money or a unit of weight or measurement. This parable is about what we do with what we have been given. We have heard the kingdom proclaimed – what do we do with it?

WORLD DAY OF THE POOR: 19 NOVEMBER 2023

For this year's World Day of the Poor, Pope Francis has instructed us "Do not turn your face away from anyone who is poor" (Tob 4:7), a message taken from the book of Tobit.

Once again, Pope Francis has issued a call to action, a call to encounter one another.

AND ITS PEOPLE: Laudato Deum

52. Today we can continue to state that, "the accords have been poorly implemented, due to lack of suitable mechanisms for oversight, periodic review and penalties in cases of noncompliance. The principles which they proclaimed still await an efficient and flexible means of practical implementation". Also, that "international negotiations cannot make significant progress due to positions taken by countries which place their national interests above the global common good. Those who will have to suffer the consequences of what we are trying to hide will not forget this failure of conscience and responsibility".

58. Once and for all, let us put an end to the irresponsible derision that would present this issue as something purely ecological, "green", romantic, frequently subject to ridicule by economic interests. Let us finally admit that it is a human and social problem on any number of levels. For this reason, it calls for involvement on the part of all. In Conferences on the climate, the actions of groups negatively portrayed as "radicalized" tend to attract attention. But in reality they are filling a space left empty by society as a whole, which ought to realize that the future of their children is at stake.
