# Fourth Sunday of Lent (Year B)

**First Reading: 2 Chronicles 36:14-16, 19-23** Disobedience, exile, and God's redemptive action in human history are on display during this short account of the Babylonian exile of God's People.

**Second Reading: Ephesians 2:4-10** Paul reminds the Church of Ephesus – and reminds us – that our own efforts do not achieve our redemption. Salvation comes from the God's gracious gift made manifest in Jesus Christ.

**Gospel: John 3:14-21** Jesus makes a clear link in today's Gospel between the bronze serpent lifted up by Moses in the desert and the salvation that will be possible by Jesus being lifted up on the Cross, an action that is the new focal point of our salvation.

Water: Minimise water consumption and reduce water wastage



16th March: Find out where you were baptised and which river that water came from. Give thanks to God for the river!


