Second Sunday of Easter - Sunday 7th April 2024

Dear Parishioners,

It is still proper to wish you; Happy Easter! I would like to acknowledge the generosity of our volunteers and the very positive feedback after our Easter Liturgies. This Second Sunday of Easter is known as Divine Mercy Sunday, established by Pope John Paul II in 2000. The liturgy shows how the mercy of God rebuilds our relationship with God and creates new relationships of fraternal solidarity among people. We not only receive and experience God's mercy, but we are also called to have mercy towards others.

Mercy can be experienced or expressed in many ways; in the forgiveness of sins; in meeting the needs of all people; in bearing the weakness of others and becoming the face of Jesus to the doubtful.

Divine Mercy and Divine Love is completely free, not the result of merit. As God's love is endless, Divine Mercy is also everlasting. God demonstrates His merciful love for us through the death and resurrection of Christ while we are still sinners. Divine Mercy is the first and eternal love of God who is the Father and the source of all true human love, even the most limited. God's love for us is not because of our "works" or our "merits".

Mercy is not simply love: it is a love that knows no limits, barriers, obstacles, frontiers: it is a love that knows how to love even those who have become "unworthy". The merciful not just give something to the poor or needy, but also to those who are "unworthy" of being given a gift. Mercy is a special power of love, which prevails over hatred, disloyalty and ingratitude.

Thank you for the good response to Ministry Sunday 2024! There are many new volunteers in our Evangelisation, Maintenance, Hospitality, Outreach and Care & Concern ministries. However, more volunteers are needed for our weekend Masses. To comfortably run each of our Masses, we need at least 20 volunteers to fill the roles of Mass Coordinator, commentator, readers, special ministers of Holy Communion, collectors, altar servers, musicians, singers and computer operators. At the moment some Mass Coordinators struggle to maintain a regular roster. Tell the person next to you to consider taking up a role in our Masses. 2024 Ministry Sunday Forms are still available and training will be provided on the following dates; Saturday 13 April, Monday 15th April and Thursday 18th April. God bless you and may the light of the resurrected Jesus enlighten everyone.

Second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday (Year B)

First Reading: Acts 4:32-35 The season of Easter features the Acts of the Apostles for the first readings. They witness to the emerging early Church. Today we hear the interdependent nature of that community and the singular purpose which drove them: to be witnesses to the living Jesus Christ.

Second Reading: 1 John 5:1-6 As we grow in love and faith in Christ, we draw on the power of God that 'conquers the world'. The world here represents all evil that stands in opposition to Christ and the values Christians are called to hold. As children of God, we share in God's victory allowing us to live the rich life of Christ.

Gospel: John 20:19-31 Unlike Thomas, we cannot see and touch the risen Christ in the flesh. However, this is not an impediment to faith. Indeed, we are invited to a special place of blessing that comes from not seeing yet believing.
