




"Christ The Vine" by Leos Moskos, c. 1648-1690. Benaki Museum

Fifth Sunday of Easter - Sunday 28th April 2024

Dear Parishioners,

On this fifth Sunday of Easter, the liturgy presents Jesus as the vine. Jesus is the true vine, because he did God's will and produced the good wine of faithfulness. Jesus is the new and authentic vine that is capable of producing life for the branches.



Jesus is the true vine and we are the branches. The branch is an extension of the vine. If the branch is not fed by the vine, it cannot produce anything. Hence, to produce fruits, we need to remain united to Christ. Remaining in Christ means having a relationship of trust and reciprocal loyalty with Jesus, founded on faith. Communion with Christ gives us life and inner strength, the capacity and constancy to transform reality and overcome evil inside and outside us.

Remaining in Christ also means not abandoning the commitments we made, especially in Baptism, and obedience to Christ's commandments which also means remaining in His love. To be separated from Jesus means absolute sterility. A Christian who does not remain united to Christ dries up and does not bear fruit. A Christian without Jesus Christ may even have a brilliant life, full of health, ideas, successful business and family but in the eyes of God, lifeless, fruitless and empty. Anyone who apparently belongs to the Church, but does not maintain a connection with Jesus, is alone in the crowd. Every person that moves away from Jesus Christ the vine tends to die. People separated from others and from God, wither, dry and die.

If we remain in communion with Jesus and "his words remain in us", we will receive everything that we ask for in his name. As branches we have no life and meaning apart from the vine. Communion with Christ and the Church is the way to overcome crises, aridity and adversity.

However, the Church as the vine also needs a lot of care. It must be pruned, watered and cleaned so that it maintains its identity and bond with the Lord of the vineyard. In this sense, the church in the vine cared by God with the Word and Sacraments. The Word and Sacraments nourish us, cleanse us, and transform us from within. Believing in the Word is bearing fruit. Living the Sacraments prunes us of worldly influences, greed, laziness, selfishness, lies, hypocrisy, etc.

Remaining in Christ entails living a life of prayer. A life of prayer means being in tune with Jesus and his plan, and that is doing God's will. This is what it means to pray in Jesus' name, and surely everything that we ask for in Jesus' name will be answered.
